College Counselling News

Last week was a busy one working on a schoolwide test called the International School Assessment. The ISA is a test that the IAA conducts to its Grade 3 – 9 students annually. It is a set of tests used by international schools and schools with international focus to monitor student progress over time and confirm that their internal assessments are aligned with international expectations of performance. It assesses students in Mathematical Literacy, Reading, Narrative Writing, Expository Writing and Scientific Literacy. Designed and developed by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER), the ISA Reading, Mathematical Literacy and Scientific Literacy assessments are based on the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA). With over 90 000 students from more than 400 schools participate in the ISA each year, the data it provides us with is invaluable. Similar to previous years, we administer the test over the course of one week (two days for each school) entirely online and results are usually released by the end of June. Over the years our results have compared positively to world averages and this is reflective of quality teaching and learning we have at our school. We feel confident that this year will once again be a successful one and we wish every student the best of luck!

Beginning the week of 26th May until June 7th, our Job Shadowing programme begins for our Grade 10 students. The expectation is for each student to secure an employment opportunity in a field s/he is hoping to pursue at university. Over the last few weeks our students have been actively seeking jobs by contacting employers and preparing CVs in preparation for their first practical experience and a taste of the real world. We know that you'll be great ambassadors for IAA and we wish you an enjoyable two working weeks.

I would like to finally bid our Class of 2024 farewell. With Externals finally over, they can now relax and enjoy a stress-free summer packed with excitement for the coming chapter. I look forward to seeing you all on stage on the 28th May.
