A Message from the Director

It was a mix of excitement, delight and slight apprehension welcoming our beloved students back to campus last week. But as we roll into our second week of teaching, life seems to have nicely settled for everyone, particularly our students. This has certainly made all those sleepless nights preparing

our school for reopening worthwhile!! You would agree it has been a difficult time for us adults coping with the new normal; it comes as no surprise therefore when we find our young children cautiously navigating their way through the newly imposed restrictions. Knowing our kids and how resilient they are, I am assured they will be just fine – trust me. For the majority, coming back to school was a priority that outweighed any limitations there might be. And a testament to this, our attendance was recorded at its highest this fall. Thank you!

It goes without saying that, you, the parents and major stakeholders, have played a huge role in helping us make the transition a seamless one. I thank you greatly for your trust, patience and ever support. As a mother and grandmother, I understand the difficulty making such choices and acknowledge the uncertainty you face every day. It is imperative therefore that you open all communication channels, perhaps now more than ever, to help ease their concerns. Naturally our school Counselors are also here to help you if you needed that extra support, so please reach out to them directly.

As much as I pray we remain settled and in our daily school routine, our continuation to work from campus remains a decision that only the Ministry of Education can take. It is worth noting that if it becomes necessary to switch to e-learning, the IAA is fully prepared and ready to make such a transition. Please ensure that your child's laptop device is aligned with all e-learning requirements; you may need to regularly refer to files on Moodle to stay updated with the status quo and to familiarize yourself with information on the adopted Platform. In the meantime, I ask that we try to maximize the time we spend on our beloved campus and appreciate the things we take for granted, not least of which, our health!

I'd like to add a small thank you note to our wonderful teachers who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure a safe return for our students. A special thank you goes out to all our returning Expat staff who have opted to remain in Jordan throughout the summer and miss time with their loved ones abroad. Equally important is to recognize the newly hired Expat staff who, despite weeks of quarantine, were still willing to travel to Jordan to honour their contracts with us. Their loyalty and commitment are greatly appreciated.

Finally, I would like to add that similar to previous years I will continue to make myself available every Tuesday for any concerns you may have. What to do if your child is running a temperature or displaying symptoms of Covid-19?

If your child has a temperature of 37.5°C or over, or is displaying symptoms that are associated with Covid-19 please keep your child at home. We ask that you call the Nurse to report that you are keeping your child at home, just like you would for any other health issues under normal circumstances.

Because we had to orientation much later in the year and there is greater structure to teaching and break spaces now, the Grade 6 transition has been one of the smoothest we have experienced.
